OUR STRATEGIC PRIORITIES

A vision for school choice

"Choice" is a word commonly used to describe the charter school movement. But compared to other sectors, educational choice is actually quite limited. Most alternatives to neighborhood schools look like enhanced public schools. Some charter schools have raised the performance bar a little, and in some cases significantly, but in the end, few school operators are asking the most important question: what do different students need to thrive and to create value in a free society?

At ResponsiveEd, we are trying to answer that question. By listening to parents in different communities for more than 20 years, we have identified several different school models that offer choices and help students thrive. Even as we achieve success with the six models listed on page 4, we are constantly listening and looking at new ways to meet student needs. To us, doing one thing, and doing it well means figuring out how to help students flourish and bringing a range of options to families as quickly as possible.

A vision for content-rich education

At ResponsiveEd, we believe that the purpose of education is three-fold: to help children develop into responsible citizens, to help them learn to be virtuous people, and to promote a free society. Together, these three priorities lead to flourishing humans. These are big ideas based on thousands of years of writing, conversation, and debate. To participate in American life in meaningful ways, students must come to understand the content of this great conversation and learn to think critically about it.

In all of our schools, we use a combination of the Core Knowledge framework and our own ResponsiveEd curriculum to pursue this goal. Through both, we expose our students to excellent books selected from our Western canon. They study American civics, focus on language arts, and develop a deep working knowledge of the physical laws that make the world function through science and math.

With this encounter with meaningful content, they learn the value of liberty in every walk of life and how to contribute meaningfully to the communities in which they live.

A vision for moral education

A view of education not often emphasized in the contemporary educational environment is that schools have an abiding responsibility to foster a sense of personal and civic virtue. This concept has deep roots in Western philosophy, but it is also found across the world and throughout time in most successful cultures.

The idea is that we must promote qualities that help us make sound decisions, put others first, and create value as we fulfill our potential. This, more than anything, helps students develop into productive adults. ResponsiveEd takes this responsibility seriously and invests a significant amount of energy in developing a sense of virtue in our students.

The nine character virtues we promote are:

We believe that these six core values help us create a customer-focused environment where we produce value for families, our employees, and our stakeholders.




"A Statement Discussing the Need for the Requested Expansion"

ResponsiveEd was authorized by the Texas State Board of Education to open 15 dropout recovery and prevention schools in 1998. The schools were designed to support students who were struggling in traditional high school settings. As demand for the charter school model grew, ResponsiveEd added new sites and educational models to be responsive to communities and stakeholders. Twenty years later, ResponsiveEd serves more than 19,000 students across 75 schools in Texas and Arkansas.

ResponsiveEd currently operates 36 Texas College Preparatory Collegiate Academies Charter campuses (35 brick and mortar campuses and 1 online campus); 34 Premier High Schools Charter campuses (32 brick and mortar campuses, 1 Foundation Autism Campus and 1 Online Campus); 1 Texas Partnership (1882) campus with Beaumont ISD and 4 brick and mortar campuses in Arkansas.

With the mission "to provide hope for students through educational options that promote a free society and cultivate moral and academic excellence", ResponsiveEd seeks to be responsive to the needs of the community by offering a variety of educational options that reflect the diverse interests, goals, and learning styles of the students in the communities we serve. Each unique model is connected by our seven guiding principles which we believe are at the heart educational excellence and equity.





GUIDING PRINCIPLES

Principle 1 | Education is an Inescapable Moral Enterprise

Education in its fullest sense is inescapably a moral enterprise – a continuous and conscious effort to guide students to know and pursue what is good and what is worthwhile.

Principle 2 | Parents

We strongly affirm parents as the primary moral educators of their children and believe school should build a partnership with the home. Consequently, all schools have the obligation to foster in their students personal and civic virtues such as integrity, courage, responsibility, diligence, service, and respect.

Principle 3 | Virtue

Character education is about developing virtues – good habits and dispositions which lead students to responsible and mature adulthood. Virtue ought to be our foremost concern in educating for character.

Principle 4 | Teachers, Principals, Staff.

The teacher and school principal are central to this enterprise and must be educated, selected, and encouraged with this mission in mind. In truth, all of the adults in the school must embody and reflect the moral authority which has been invested in them by the parents and the community.

Principle 5 | Community

Character education is not a single course, quick-fix program, or a slogan posted on the wall; it is an integral part of school life. The school must become a community of virtue in which responsibility, hard work, honesty, and kindness are modeled, taught, expected, celebrated, and continually practiced.

Principle 6 | Curriculum

The human community has a reservoir of moral experiences, much of which exists in our great stories, works of art, literature, history, and biography. Teachers and students must together draw from this reservoir both within and beyond the academic curriculum.

Principle 7 | Students

Young people need to realize that forging their own character is an essential and demanding life task. The sum of school experiences – in success and failures, academic and athletic, intellectual and social – provides much of the raw material for this personal undertaking.

EDUCATION MODELS



Premier High Schools

Premier High Schools, the highest achieving alternative programs in the state of Texas, are mastery-based, blended-learning, college preparatory programs that place an emphasis on credit recovery, early graduation, and career and technical training, as well as character education, a key component in ResponsiveEd programs. Premier High Schools offer flexible schedules and personalized academic pathways that allow students to progress through high school coursework at their own pace and progression. Since its inception, the PHS model has helped close to 12,000 students graduate from high school and progress into postsecondary education and careers.



Classical and Founders Classical Academies

The Classical/Founders Classical Academy model is founded in the belief that a classical education, rooted in an approach that goes back to ancient Greece and Rome, provides students with the tools of learning necessary to be well-rounded human beings who know who they are and understand the world around them. We believe that these tools help students acquire the knowledge, skills, and dispositions necessary to live virtuous and happy lives.

A new component was added to the Classical Academies model in 2017. This component, THRIVE, is a school improvement initiative designed to provide operational and academic support to help schools meet the needs of educationally disadvantaged students. THRIVE includes a systemic process for school transformation and academic turnaround.



iSchool High

iSchool High campuses utilize a mastery-based, blended-learning program with an emphasis on community-specific academic pathways. iSchool High has established a creative and innovative partnership with local community colleges that allow students to enroll in dual credit courses and have the opportunity to earn both their high school diploma and up to an Associate's Degree.



iSchool Virtual Academy

Each ResponsiveEd district offers an online rigorous, mastery-based, blended-learning, college preparatory program to students who prefer work at home. Virtual students work and learn from home with live instruction and one-on-one teacher interaction through a virtual classroom setting. Students receive additional help through our Success Centers, ResponsiveEd academic support centers where students sign up for in-person tutoring or have a quiet place to work. Through these centers, we also provide access to a homework helpline in the event the student is in need of after-hour support and cannot access their teacher.



Foundation School for Autism

The Foundation School for Autism in San Antonio provides a customized education experience for children ages 3-7 who are on the autism spectrum. Students are placed in classrooms with a staff to student ratio ranging from 2:1 to 7:1, with state-certified Special Education Teachers and Instructional Assistants who are Board Certified Behavior Analysts, Speech Language Pathologists, and Occupational Therapists. Each child receives an individual educational plan to develop and improve key areas such as learning readiness, independent work, and academics. Our model includes teaching important socio-emotive skills to help children navigate challenging social situations, and it emphasizes parent engagement and training in the skills that will help them enable their children to have successful school experiences.

CURRENT AND PROJECTED FINANCIAL CONDITION

ResponsiveEd operates two Charter Districts – Texas College Preparatory Academies and Premier High Schools. ResponsiveEd is a financially sustainable organization with more than 150 days of operating cash on hand and a BBB credit rating with Standard & Poor's. Through our bond funders, we purchase property and build schools across Texas. Throughout the years our TCPA and PHS Charters have consistently maintained a Superior or Above Standard rating with Charter FIRST. Each requested campus expansion will be operated in an efficient manner to ensure long-term financial sustainability with the expectation of being self-funding within its first two years of operations. In addition, ResponsiveEd was recently awarded a five-year Charter School Program Expansion and Replication grant in the amount of \$41,000,000. Funds received from this federal grant will be used by ResponsiveEd to start-up new Premier High School campuses.

Debt Instruments

"A Statement discussing the use of debt instruments to finance part or all of the charter school's incremental costs"

In the fall of 2018 Responsive Education Solutions secured a Line of Credit in the amount of \$81,500,000 from Regions Commercial Equipment Finance to fund the incremental costs associated with adding new campuses. We anticipate utilizing this line of credit both for the Texas College Preparatory Academies and Premier High Schools Charter school expansions.

Acquisition Cost

Current net assets will be used to fund the incremental cost of acquiring facilities, furniture, and equipment to accommodate the enrollment for the Texas College Preparatory Academies Charter and Premier High Schools Charter proposed campus expansions.

Personnel

"A Statement discussing the incremental cost of additional on-site personnel and identifying the additional number of full-time equivalents that will be employed"

The cost of on-site personnel at the Texas College Preparatory Academies Charter and the Premier High Schools Charter proposed campus expansions will be funded using the Foundation School Program funds received in operating the proposed campus expansions. ResponsiveEd anticipates adding one FTE teacher for every 22 students enrolled at the proposed TCPA campuses and one FTE teacher for every 25 students for the proposed PHS campuses. In addition, each campus will employ a Campus Principal, Assistant Principal, Secretary, and one FTE Special Education teacher per 10 special education students. Additional teacher's aides will be employed as needed. ResponsiveEd's Human Resources, Director of Recruiting and District Leadership recruits and places highly qualified full and part-time staff at its charter schools throughout Texas and Arkansas. Our HR team will partner with statewide and community-based organizations to provide a talent acquisition pipeline to ensure highly qualified staff is selected for the 2020-21 and 2021-22 school expansions.

Highly qualified and effective teachers supervise the academic and instructional program in each of the educational models at ResponsiveEd. In accordance with the guidelines of the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards, ResponsiveEd teachers are expected to adhere to the following standards:

- 1. Teachers are committed to students and their learning.
- 2. Teachers are dedicated to making knowledge accessible to all students and believe all students can learn. They treat students equitably—recognizing the individual differences that distinguish their students from one another and taking these differences into account in their practice.
- 3. Teachers know the subjects they teach and how to teach those subjects to students.
- 4. Teachers will demonstrate mastery over the subject(s) they teach and have a deep understanding of the history, structure and real-world applications of the subject.
- 5. Teachers are responsible for managing and monitoring student learning
- **6.** Teachers are effective at delivering instruction; move fluently through a range of instructional techniques—keeping students motivated, engaged and focused; and know how to organize instruction to meet instructional goals.
- 7. Teachers think systematically about their practice and learning from experience
- 8. Teachers will model what it means to be an educated person and practice lifelong learning.
- 9. Teachers are members of learning communities Teachers will collaborate with others educators at their campus (and beyond) to improve student learning.

ResponsiveEd understands professional development is vital to the success of our schools. Therefore, we dedicate substantial time to this process each summer and throughout the school year. Professional Development sessions allow ResponsiveEd leadership teams an opportunity to introduce new faculty members to the ResponsiveEd philosophy and practices. This time also provides an opportunity for our leadership teams to introduce staff members to school turnaround strategies and goals that will be required for a successful school year for the students, parents, staff, and stakeholders.

ResponsiveEd's Learning Academy is comprised of a Director of Live Training, Director of Virtual Learning, and Support Staff. The goal of the Learning Academy is to provide sustainable training that promotes student academic achievement and leadership growth.

The Learning Academy works with Content Directors and Instructional Coaches to assess the needs of training. This is measured by teacher feedback from previous training events, classroom observations, and school accountability reports. Needs assessments, surveys, and data analysis is reviewed to determine specific areas of focus for professional development offerings. With this information, we are able to design a comprehensive training plan for new and existing teachers that is aligned with the goals of our home office and the campus.

EXPANSION SITES

Trade Area Identification

The following ResponsiveEd expansion sites were initially identified through community outreach, vetted through comprehensive household demographic analysis, and finally given an overall "site score" based on both demand and data.

In our 20 year history of serving students across four distinct brick and mortar educational models, common data points began to emerge. From this information, we have created household models to represent families with the highest likelihood of enrolling at a ResponsiveEd school. We then compare our household models with the demographic information in a potential "trade area" or potential campus location. Based on the results of this analysis, potential locations receive a "site score". Ideally, the site score would be 95 or higher.

There are times when a groundswell of community support within a trade area will offset a mediocre site score. In these instances, we perform additional community outreach to ensure the long-term viability of a ResponsiveEd school in the area.







Variable Definitions 2018 TCPA Model

Variables below in **green** have a positive effect while those in **red** have a negative effect as they increase.

Index values are centered around an average value of 100. Higher and lower scores should be interpreted as the degree to which that variable is measured to be higher or lower than the average observed measures of that variable.

Student Value - Takes into account the segmentation of households within 18 minutes and their distance to a TCPA campus. Household values are determined by both segmentation and proximity. (Higher is better)

Quality of Area Schools - Takes into account the average TEA school performance and the percent of schools that meet the TEA standards within 8 minutes and 18 minutes, giving more weight to those schools that are within 8 minutes. (Higher is better)

Competition - The ratio of elementary and middle schools to the number of core customer households at 9 and 18 minutes, where schools captured within 9 minutes are weighted more. Additionally, charter schools are weighted twice as much as all other schools. (Higher is better)

Student Demand - Calculates students demand based on the ADA of the network's top 5 most similar campuses based on the model variables listed above.

Elementary School Student Universe - The total student enrollment of elementary schools captured within 18 minutes.

Middle School Student Universe - The total student enrollment of middle schools captured within 18 minutes.












