## What happens during the lottery?

Applications are drawn randomly and assigned rank order. Results will only be posted at the respective campuses.



## When are lottery results posted?

The results of the lottery will be sent to parents via email by their respective campuses.



#### Do I accept/decline my seat offering during the lottery?

No. You will be contacted within 48 hours following the lottery, via phone or email, requesting your response.



# Am I required to be physically present during the lottery?

You are not required to be physically present to be awarded a seat. Priority is not given to lottery attendees.

## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

#### » What is a local lottery?

When the number of student applications exceed available classroom seats, a local lottery is required. Student names (or numbers assigned to names) will be drawn for each available seat.

- » Will my student's priority status be taken into consideration during the lottery?
- Yes. However, consideration does not guarantee a seat.
- » When are the results announced? All applicants will be contacted via email within 48 hours following the lottery. Please contact your campus directly for more information.
- » How long do I have to respond to an offer of admission?

If a parent fails to respond within 48 hours of receiving their telephone call, or e-mail offer, they will forfeit the seat that has been awarded.

- » What happens to the remaining applications? The remaining applicants are placed on a waiting list in the order in which they were drawn. An email will be sent to families regarding their status on the waiting list within 48 hours of the lottery.
- » What if I have more than one child applying, but only one is selected?

The applicant not selected will remain on the waiting list until a seat becomes available.
