



#### TEKS Certification 2023-24 Form

In accordance with <u>Texas Education Code §31.004</u>, local education agencies (LEAs) are required to certify annually to the State Board of Education (SBOE) and the commissioner that students have access to instructional materials covering all Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS) for all required subjects, except physical education.

Additionally, in accordance with Texas Administrative Code 19 TAC §66.105, LEAs are required to certify that they protect against access to obscene or harmful content in compliance with the requirements for certification under the Children's Internet Protection Act, 47 USC §254(h)(5)(B) and (C). The TEKS Certification 2023–24 Survey includes a section to allow LEAs to certify they meet this requirement.

In response to feedback from last year's process, the agency refined the TEKS Certification Process and will utilize the following tools:

#### TEKS Certification 2023-24 Form:

Printable, hard copy of the survey to be completed offline and presented to the board of trustees or governing body for ratification and signatures.

#### **TEKS Certification 2023-24 Survey:**

Web-based application where LEAs will submit their responses, collected on the TEKS Certification 2023-24 Form, and where LEAs will upload the signature page of the Form.

This year's TEKS Certification Process requires:

- The completion of the TEKS Certification 2023-24 Form,
- Ratification by the LEA's board of trustees or governing body in an open, public-noticed meeting; and
- Submission of the TEKS Certification 2023-24 Survey and upload of the signature page of the ratified TEKS Certification 2023-24 Form.

TEA recommends that LEAs complete these steps by **May 1, 2023**. The TEKS Certification 2023-24 Survey can be accessed beginning on March 20, 2023, on the Instructional Materials webpage.

The state online instructional materials ordering system, EMAT, will close for annual maintenance on March 31, 2023, and is scheduled to reopen on May 15, 2023. <u>Completion of the TEKS Certification Process is required to regain access</u> to allotment funds when EMAT reopens in May of 2023.

TEKS Certification 2023–24 Survey submissions received after May 15, 2023, will typically be processed within five business days, then access to EMAT provided.

#### Instructions to Complete the TEKS Certification Process for 2023-24

- 1. Review the TEKS Certification 2023-24 Form.
- 2. Gather information: The form may require consultation with content area leads or other LEA staff.
- 3. Complete TEKS Certification 2023-24 Form: Complete the TEKS Certification 2023-24 Form by hand or digitally.
- 4. **Obtain needed signatures**: Ratify the **TEKS Certification 2023-24 Form** by the LEA's board of trustees or governing body in an upcoming, open board meeting.
- 5. **Submit TEKS Certification 2023-24 Survey**: Complete the online TEKS Certification 2023–24 Survey by answering the questions. Inside the survey you will upload the signature page of the signed Allotment and TEKS

Certification 2023–24 Form from Step 4. The survey will be open for submissions beginning Monday, March 20, 2023, and will be located on the <u>Instructional Materials website</u>.

This year's TEKS Certification Process requires:

- The completion of the TEKS Certification 2023-24 Form,
- Ratification by the LEA's board of trustees or governing body in an open, public-noticed meeting; and
- Submission of the TEKS Certification 2023-24 Survey and upload of the signature page of the ratified TEKS Certification 2023-24 Form.

TEA recommends that LEAs complete these steps by **May 1, 2023**. The TEKS Certification 2023-24 Survey can be accessed beginning on March 20, 2023, on the Instructional Materials webpage.

The state online instructional materials ordering system, EMAT, will close for annual maintenance on March 31, 2023, and is scheduled to reopen on May 15, 2023. <u>Completion of the TEKS Certification Process is required to regain access</u> to allotment funds when EMAT reopens in May of 2023.

TEKS Certification 2023–24 Survey submissions received after May 15, 2023, will typically be processed within five business days, then access to EMAT provided.

# 10. <u>Updates to Policies</u>

## **ResponsiveEd**\*

#### 2023-2024 ResponsiveEd Updated Meal Charge Policy

#### The goal of ResponsiveEd is to provide students with healthy meals each day.

The purpose of this policy is to insure compliance with federal reporting requirements for the USDA Child Nutrition Program, and to provide oversight and accountability for the collection of outstanding student meal balances as unpaid charges can place a large financial burden on our Child Nutrition Department and the District.

#### Policy:

We strongly discourage meal charges, but we understand that an occasional emergency makes it necessary. If a student's account goes negative in balance, students are allowed to charge up to 3 reimbursable breakfasts and 3 reimbursable lunches.. After the charging limit has been reached, a courtesy meal will be offered and charged to the student.

Any negative balance on the student(s) cafeteria account is the responsibility of the parent/guardian. If a student's meal account has a negative balance, parents/guardians will receive regular email notifications. Parents/guardians are able to set up further notifications and monitor balances in their Skyward Family Access account. If parents or guardians need assistance setting up their child's meal account, they can contact their student's school.

If a student's account is without money on a consistent basis, the administration will investigate the situation to determine if there is a financial hardship. Should a hardship exist, parents and families will be encouraged to apply for free or reduced-price meals for their child throughout the school year.

A La Carte (extras) such as snacks, beverages, second meals are available for purchase only. Students are not allowed to charge A La Carte items. Students are encouraged to pre-load money into their lunch accounts for convenience. Funds are required to "charge" these items to the student lunch account.

#### **Food Service Applications:**

Applications are to be completed electronically in Skyward Family Access. Please submit one application per household. Applications received electronically are processed more quickly.

#### Refunds:

Withdrawn, and graduating students; a written request for a refund of any funds remaining in their account must be submitted to their student's school. An e-mail request is also acceptable. Students who are graduating at the end of the year are also given the option to transfer remaining funds to a sibling's account, or donate the remaining funds to the campus with a written request that they be set aside for a student with a delinquent account due to financial need.

#### SEC. 1. STANDARDS FOR ADMINISTERING MEDICATION AT SCHOOL

All medications administered to students shall be FDA-approved pharmaceuticals administered within their approved dosage and within standards of acceptable medical regimen. Research pharmaceuticals may be administered if they are a part of a University Institutional Review Board-approved protocol. Intravenous (IV) medications and treatments shall not be administered by Texas College Preparatory Academies personnel.

#### Sec. 2. Authorized Personnel

Texas College Preparatory Academies' employees shall not give any student prescription medication, nonprescription medication, herbal substances, or dietary supplements of any type, except as provided below. Employees authorized by the Superintendent or designee may administer to students:

#### a) Administering Prescription Medication

Prescription medication upon written request to administer the medication from the student's parent, guardian, or other person having legal control of the student. When administering prescription medication, the medication must be administered either:

- 1. From a container that appears to be from the original container and properly labeled; or
- 2. From a properly labeled unit dosage container filled by a registered nurse from a container that appears to be the original container and to be properly labeled.

All prescription medications shall have been prescribed by a physician licensed to practice medicine in the United States. All medications shall have been manufactured in the United States.

#### b) Administering Nonprescription Medication

i. Nonprescription Medication Administered upon Parent Request

Nonprescription medication may be administered by authorized Texas College Preparatory Academies personnel upon a parent's written request, when properly labeled and in the original container; or if required by the individualized education program ("IEP") or Section 504 plan of a student with disabilities.

#### ii. Nonprescription Medication Administered by Texas College Preparatory Academies

Authorized Texas College Preparatory Academies personnel may administer nonprescription medication on an emergency basis and consistent with protocols established by Texas College Preparatory Academies's medical adviser and parent consent given on an emergency treatment form.

#### c) Herbal Substances or Dietary Supplements

Herbal substances or dietary supplements may be administered by authorized Texas College Preparatory Academies personnel <u>only if</u> required by the IEP or Section 504 plan of a student with disabilities.

#### d) Provision of Medication Off-Campus at School-Sponsored Events

For any Texas College Preparatory Academies student attending a field trip or off-campus school-sponsored event, any prescription medication that Texas College Preparatory Academies is required to administer under this policy shall be sent with the student's teacher or another staff member trained in the proper administration of medication and who has been authorized to administer medication by the Superintendent or designee, along with instructions on the administration of the medication.

In addition to trained and authorized Texas College Preparatory Academies teacher(s) and/or nurse(s), a licensed physician in Texas, a registered nurse licensed in Texas, or a vocational nurse licensed in Texas may serve as a Texas College Preparatory Academies volunteer to administer prescription and non-prescription medication in accordance with this policy when on field trips and/or off-campus or on school-sponsored events. Prior to being allowed to do so, such individuals must meet with the school nurse for instruction and training on administration of medication for applicable students.

Nonprescription medication(s) generally are not administered by Texas College Preparatory Academies during field trips and/or off-campus or on school-sponsored events.

In the event of an emergency medical situation involving a Texas College Preparatory Academies student for which no Texas College Preparatory Academies employee was previously aware and that occurs during a field trip and/or during an off-campus, school-sponsored event when no school nurse is present, emergency medical services shall immediately be notified by any Texas College Preparatory Academies employee in attendance.

#### Sec. 3. Psychotropics

Except as permitted by Education Code 38.016, a Texas College Preparatory Academies employee shall not:

- 1. Recommend to a student, parent that the student use a psychotropic drug;
- 2. Suggest a particular diagnosis; or
- 3. Exclude the student from a class or a school-related activity because of the parent's refusal to consent to psychiatric evaluation or examination or treatment of the student.

Education Code 38.016.

#### Sec. 4. Opioid Antagonist Medication

A Texas College Preparatory Academies-employed (i) Registered Nurse, (ii) Licensed Vocational Nurse, or (iii) other properly trained and designated individual shall be authorized to administer opioid antagonist medication, such as Naloxone, to assist a person who is reasonably believed to be experiencing an opioid-related overdose. These authorized persons may administer this medication in accordance with a standing order and/or procedures provided and/or approved by a physician licensed to practice medicine in the State of Texas. The employee shall promptly seek additional medical assistance for the person to whom the medication is administered.

#### a) On Campus

Texas College Preparatory Academies-employed authorized personnel identified in the preceding paragraph may administer the opioid antagonist medication on a school campus or at a school sponsored event in accordance with this policy and applicable administrative regulations.

#### b) Maintenance, Availability, and Training

Before any RN, LVN, or other designated and trained Texas College Preparatory Academies employee may have custody of or administer an opioid antagonist medication under this policy, the employee must successfully complete an annual training program provided by Texas College Preparatory Academies, which includes recognizing opioid-related overdoses, administering opioid antagonist medication, and promptly seeking medical attention for suspected drug overdoses. A list of employees who successfully complete such training shall be maintained, updated, and kept in the district administrative office.

Texas College Preparatory Academies shall provide RNs, LVNs, and other relevant school personnel with the opportunity to complete such training during their regular work schedule.

Opioid antagonist medication shall be stored with the automated external defibrillator (AED) in each school's emergency box, accessible by designated and trained employees, and in accordance with the drug manufacturer's instructions. Opioid antagonist medication shall be made readily available to designated employees who have completed the required training to administer in the event of suspected drug overdose. All designated and properly trained employees shall be made aware of the exact location of the opioid antagonist medication.

The school nurse, or designee shall regularly inventory and verify opioid antagonist medication supply, and maintain records thereof, in accordance with the established internal procedures and manufacturer recommendations. Expired, damaged, or used opioid antagonist medication shall be disposed of in accordance with established medical waste disposal procedures.

#### c) Course and Scope of Employment

Texas College Preparatory Academies will consider the administration of opioid antagonist medication by a properly trained employee under this Policy to be acting in the course and scope of his or her employment, and therefore entitled to defense by Texas College Preparatory Academies, if the following conditions are met:

- 1. The designated and trained employee did not act with the intent to harm or with reckless indifference to a substantial risk or harm in administering opioid antagonist medication to that individual.
- 2. The designated and trained employee successfully completed the training contemplated by this Policy.
- 3. The designated and trained employee administering the opioid antagonist medication promptly sought additional medical assistance.
- 4. The designated and trained employee is administering opioid antagonist medication pursuant to this policy.

#### d) Notice to Parents

Texas College Preparatory Academies shall provide notice to parents regarding the opioid antagonist medication program, including notice of any change to or discontinuation of this program.

The houses were recently unused, vacant, and had issues such as asbestos, structural damage, holes in roofs, etc.


#### The Sale and Bid Process:
